This year we will spotlight three different areas that we know to be of particular interest to CRLA conference-goers. On Friday, November 4, you are invited to attend a spotlight session on your preferred topic as experts in each of these fields will spend an hour sharing with you the state of each.

First Things First: Holistic Support of First-Generation College Students

WyKeshia Atkins

As of the 2015-2016 academic year, 56% of undergraduate students entering college were classified as first-generation-college students and 59% were the first sibling in their family to attend college (RTI International, 2019a). Although this population is entering the higher education landscape at a high rate, only 20% of first-generation college students attained a bachelors degree and 24% attained an associates degree or certificate after being enrolled in college for 6 years (RTI International, 2019b). As higher education institutions, we are successful in getting these students into the classroom but fall short on persistence and graduation.

This session will include identification of barriers and struggles of this student population, sharing of best practices of those higher education institutions that have been successful in supporting their first-generation college students, and provide the student perspective of the decision to attend college and motivation for success.

Fostering Spaces of Belonging and Engagement in Learning Centers

Marco A. Ortiz

What elements of a Learning Center contribute to workplace culture and environment? This session will discuss the importance of creating environments that foster a sense of belonging for peer educators: including tutors, supplemental instruction leaders, and peer mentors/coaches. We will examine the components of a Learning Center that should be considered when designing an environment that fosters sense of belonging and positivity. We will also discuss the benefits of student employees feeling connected to their peers, their profession, and their institution.


Why CRLA Members' Work Is Equity Work and How to (Re)Center Equity in Our Practice

This year's tour will take us to three public institutions of higher education. Our first stop is University of California San Diego where you will visit the Academic Achievement Hub. UC San Diego's Academic Achievement Hub offers content tutoring, supplemental instruction and learning strategies designed to reinforce and extend students' learning with a focus on improving academic success, retention, and completion rates. Next on the tour is Grossmont College, a public 2-year community college serving roughly 19,000 full and part-time students per semester. Here, you will visit the Learning Assistance program that focuses on academic success of current students as well as retention and transition. The last stop includes a tour of the Mesa Tutoring and Computing Centers (MT2C) at San Diego Mesa College, the largest community college in San Diego. The MT2C empowers students and tutors while fostering a community of mindful learners through equitable academic practices.
